**They also wear badges like this.**



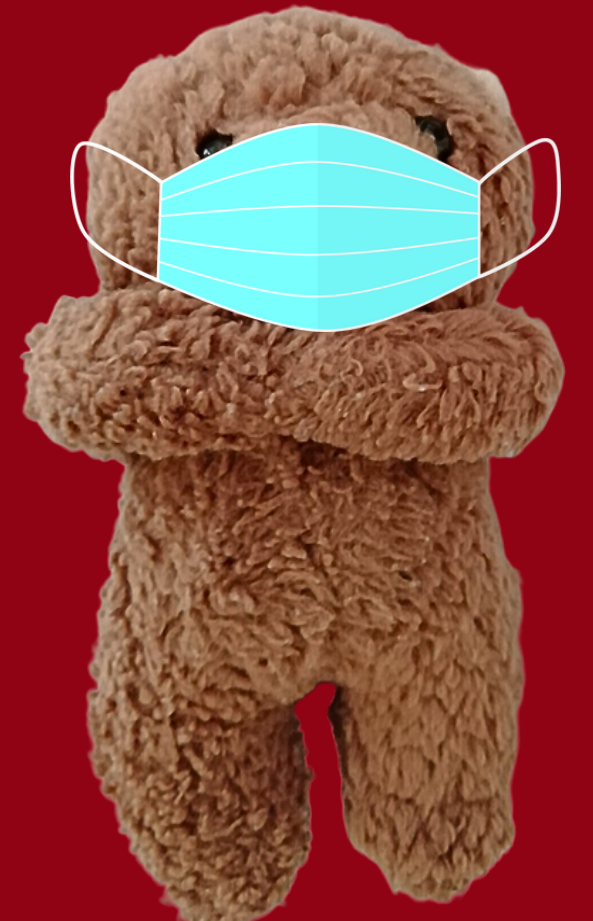
**If you need any help please speak to them.**

**You do not have to wear one unless you want to.**

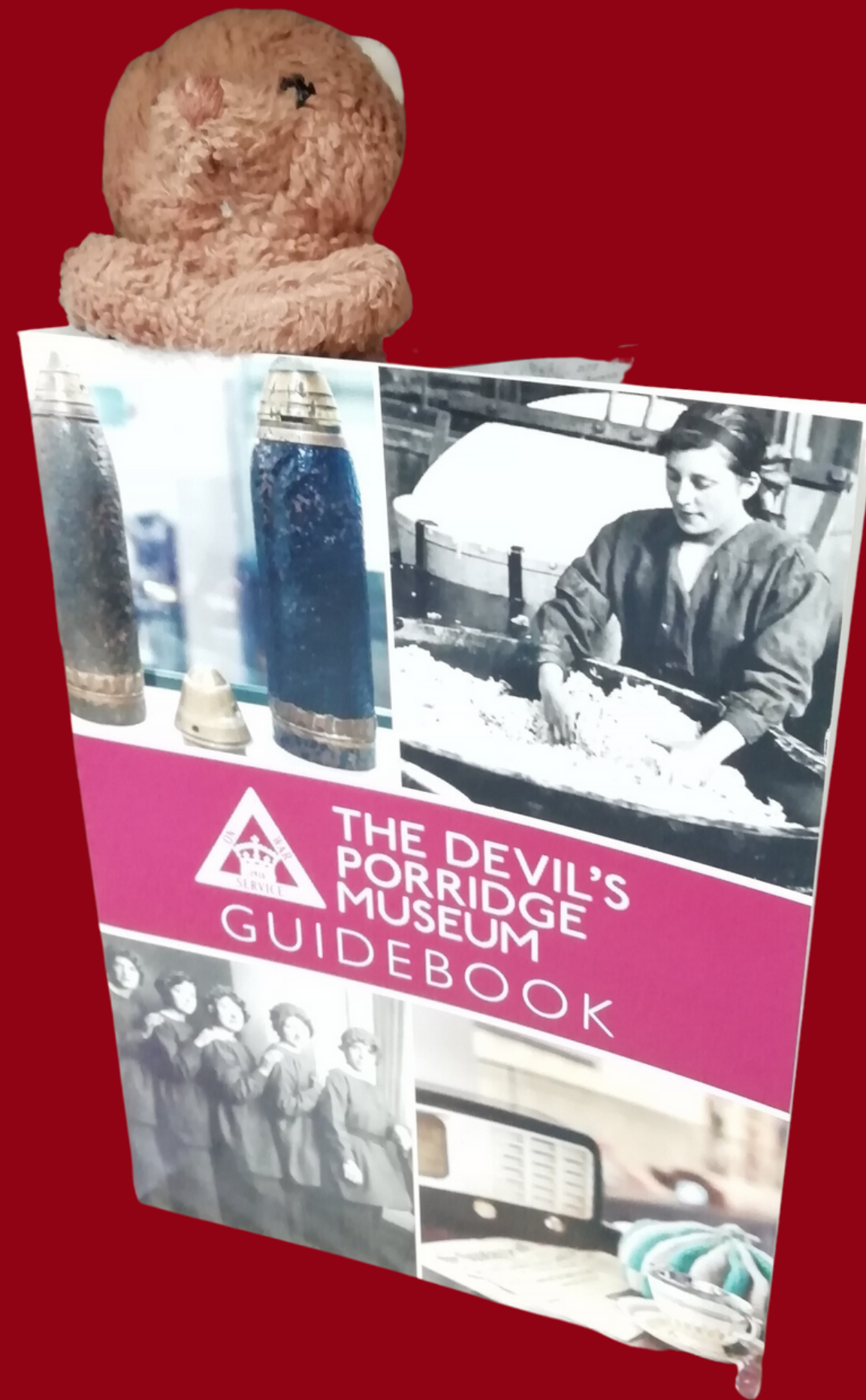






**You will need to pay at the desk. Unless you have booked online.**

**You can also get an audio guide to listen to during your visit here.**

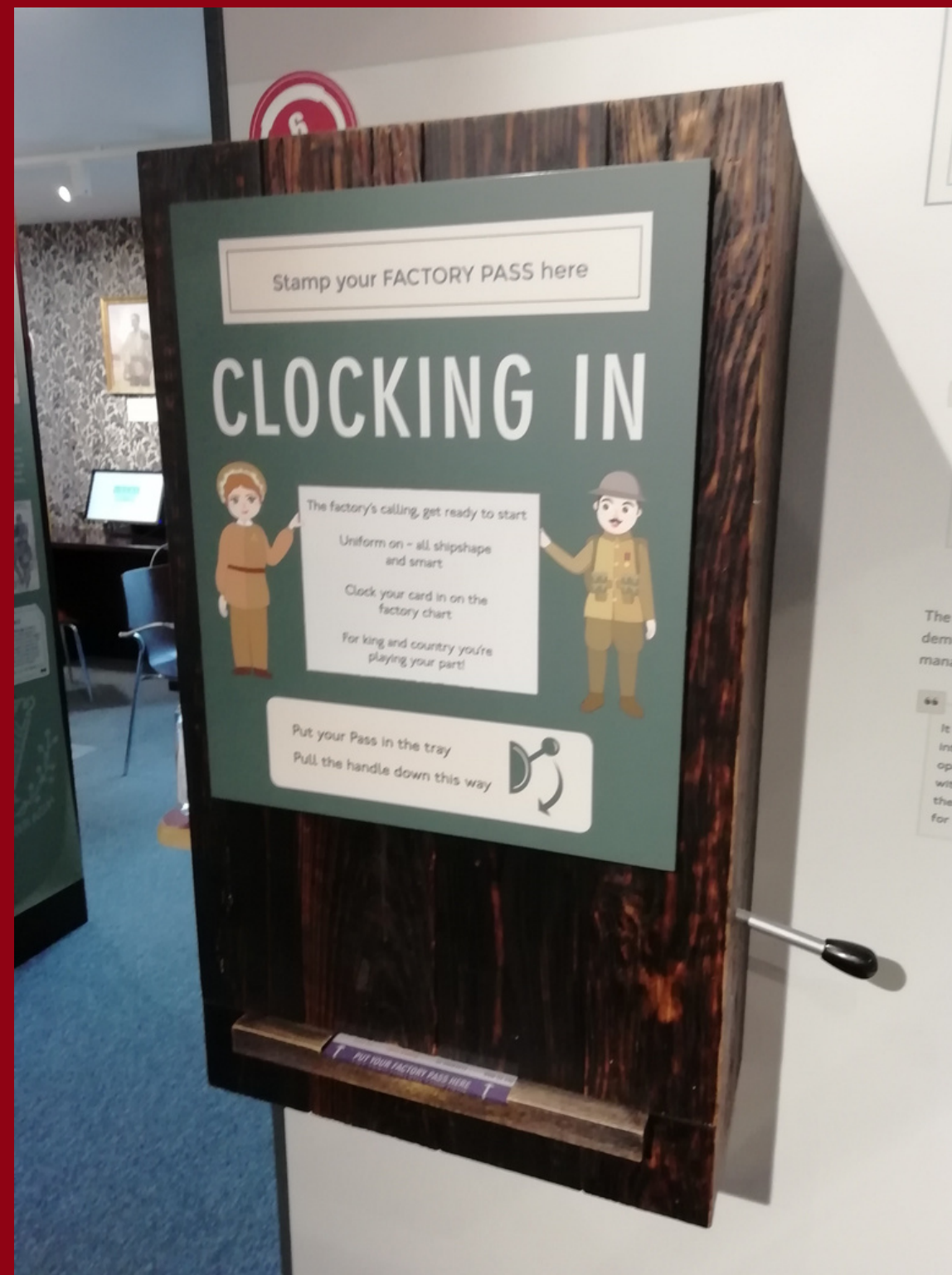
**You will need to return this at the end.**

the arrows on the floor around.**



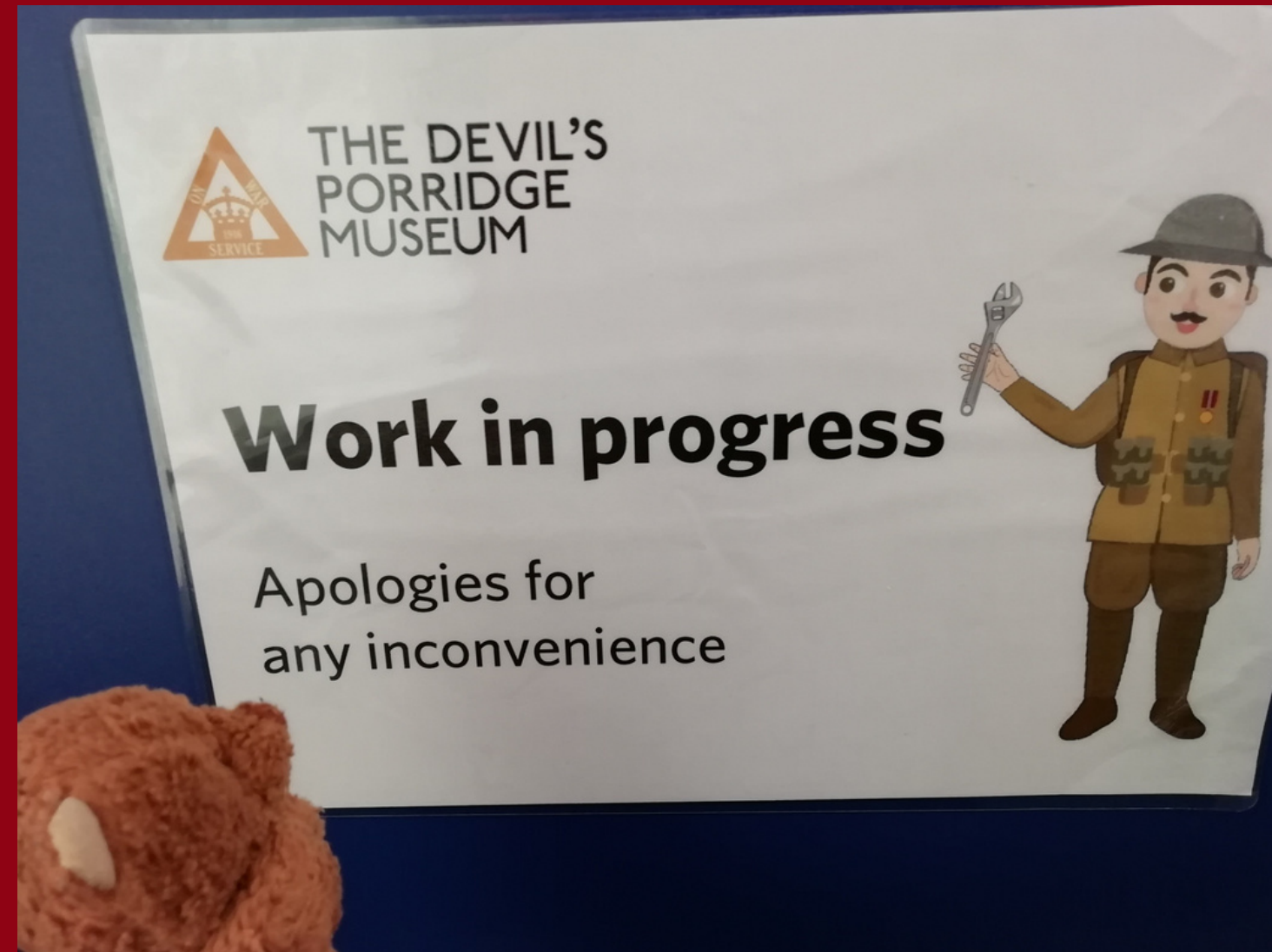


**There are chairs

There will be a display about the State Management.

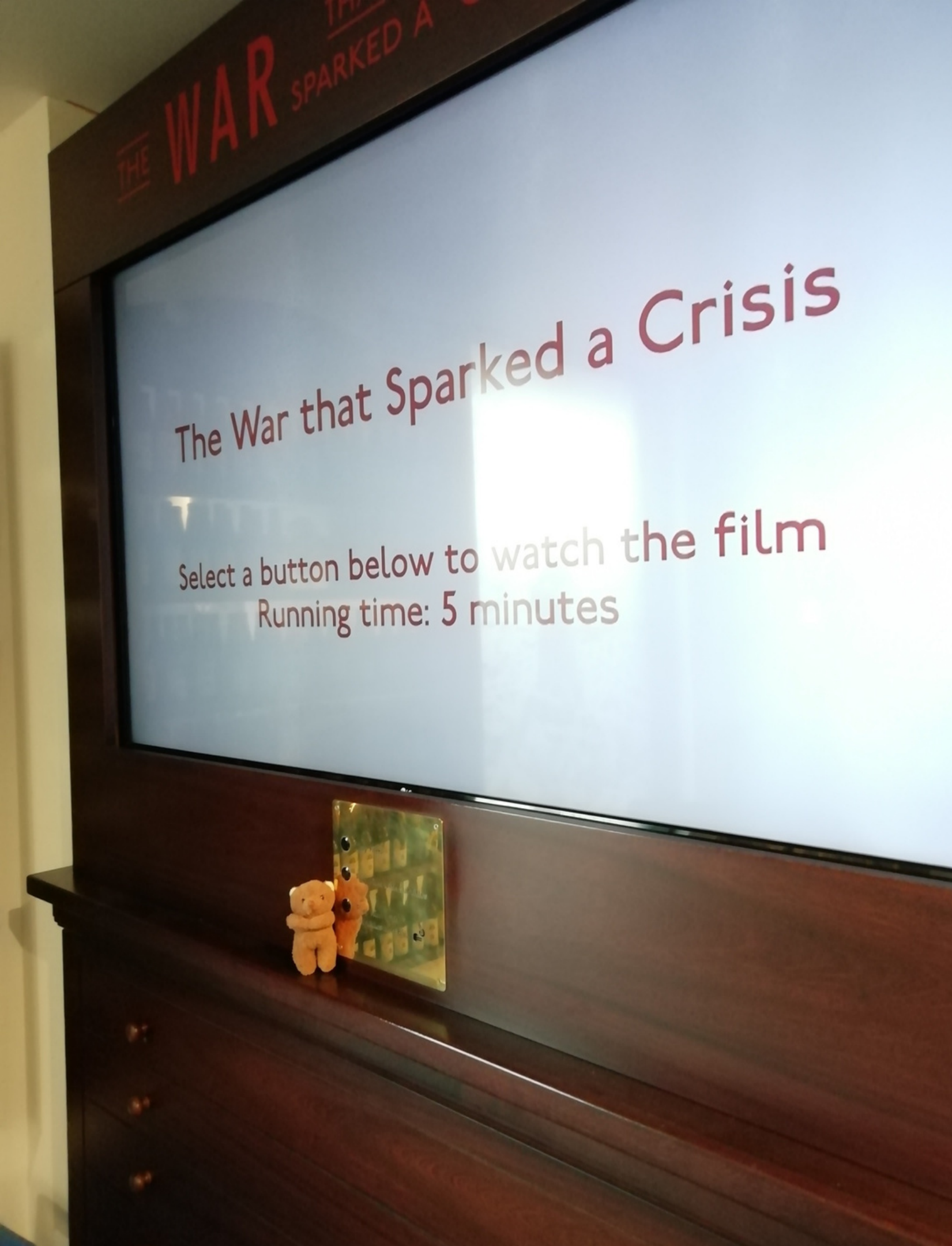




**On the wall is a mirror

on H.M. Factory Gretna**





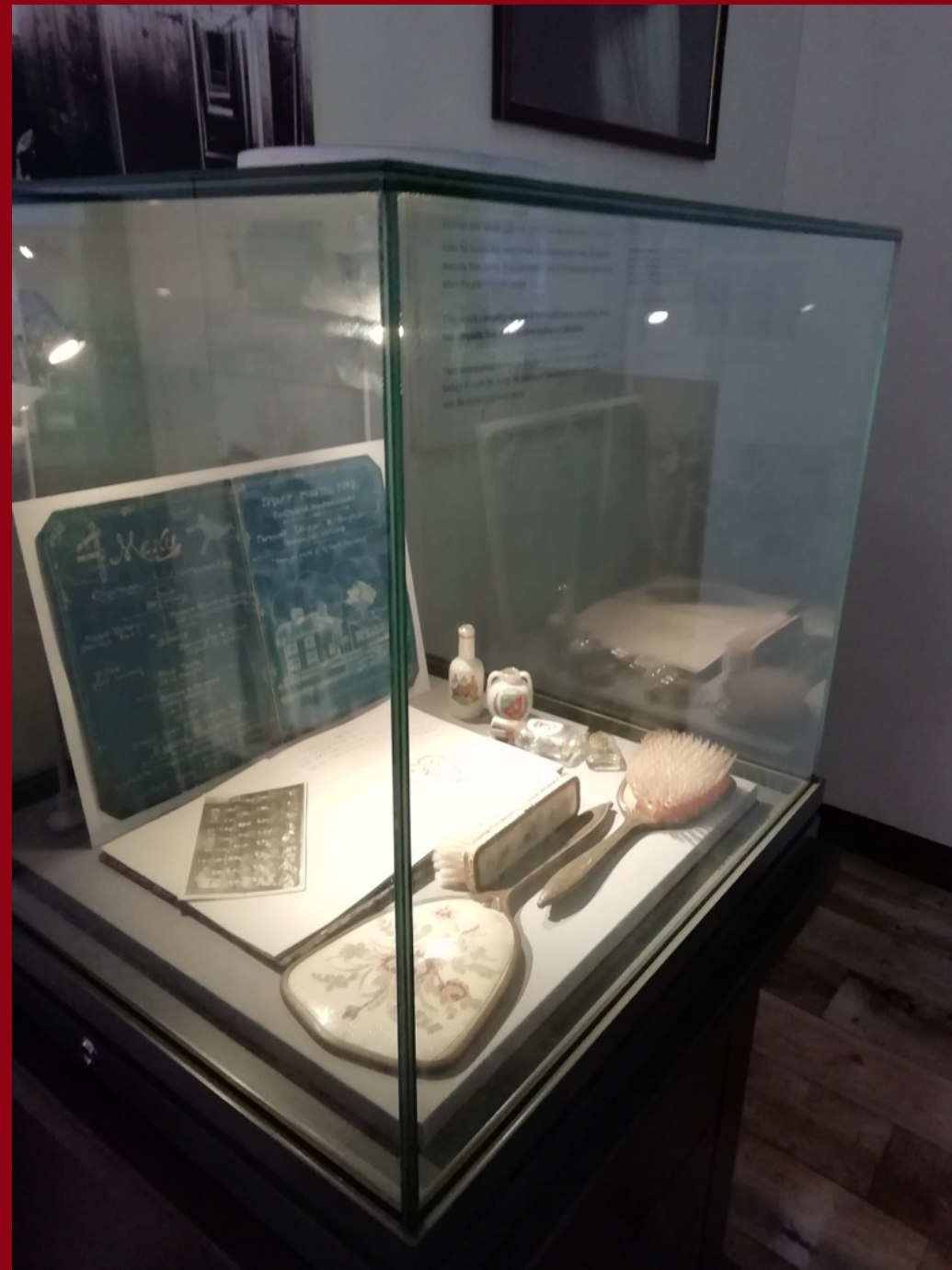
**You will hear some clicking sounds in this section and you may hear talking from the next section.**

**This section is about a munition workers bedroom. You will hear talking here.**



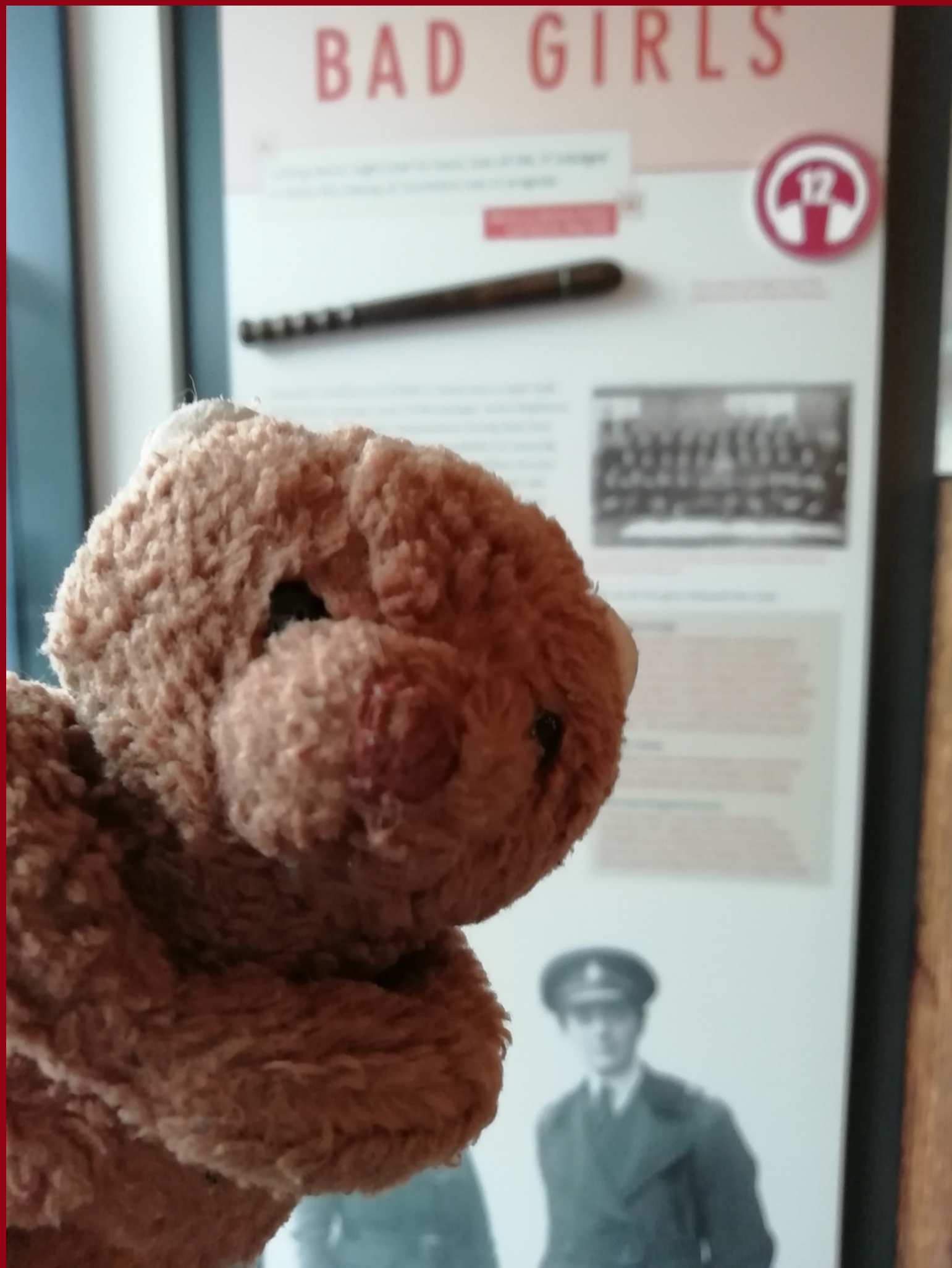


**There will be a

**This is our exhibtion area.**





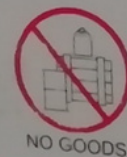

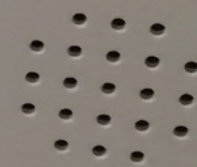

in this area.**

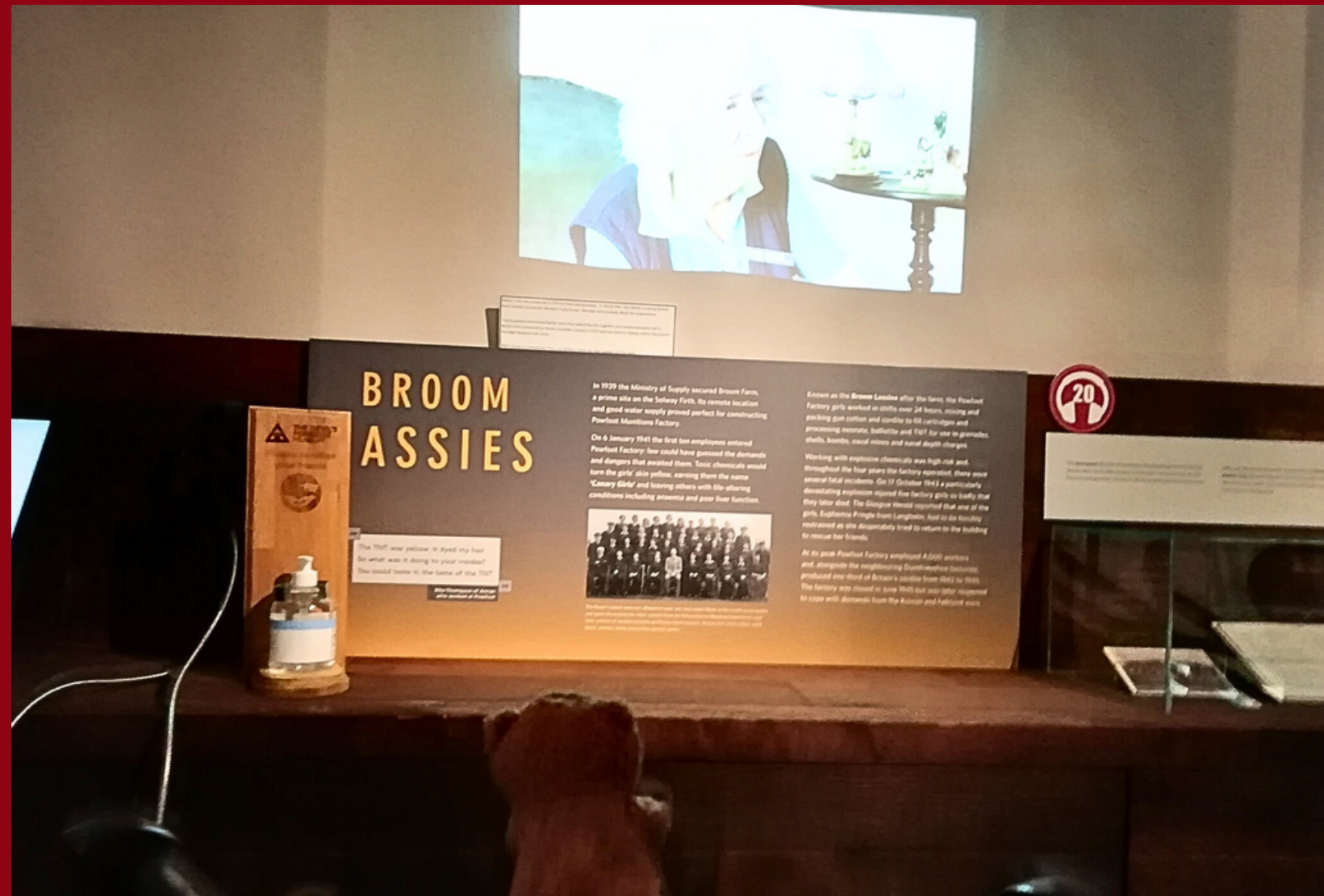




**There is a gas mask

uniform you can look at.**





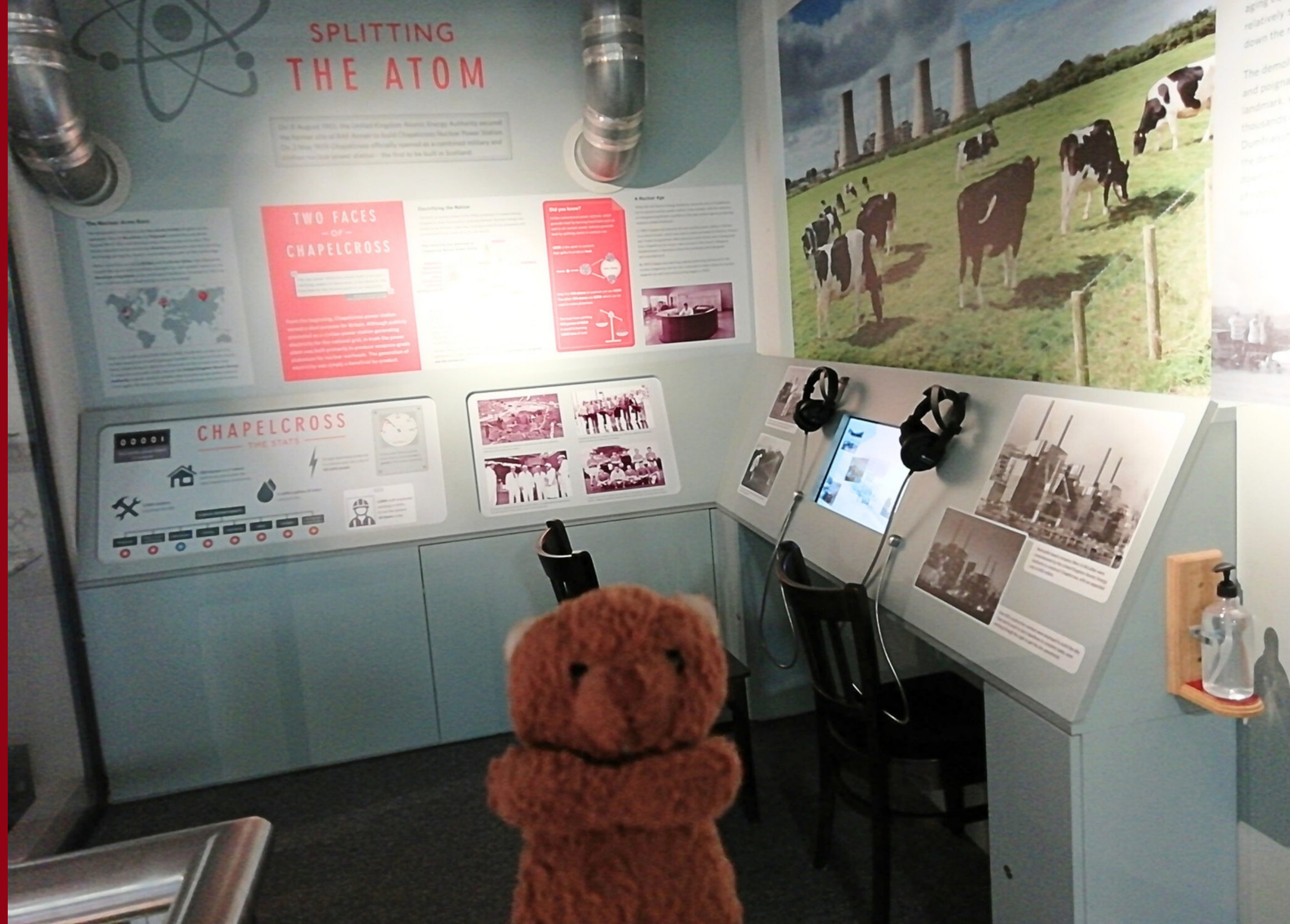
**There is also an engine from a plane and a 3D map. You can look at these.**
